#### COE UPDATE

Donna provided a COE update (Council for Occupational Education). COE is our accrediting body for our ACE programs. This accreditation allows us to facilitate Pell funding for our adult students. In order to continue to maintain accreditation, we continue to attend various conferences. Russell Penner, Venita Christman, and Rebecca Nelson will be attending the annual meeting in November. Also, our strategic plan is designed specifically for COE for our ACE programs. Our COE team will be updating our strategic plan for approval. We are doing our in-house approvals with our faculty and making sure we are compliant with COE. Mrs. Van Metre mentioned that Russell remains active and he serves on the COE appeals team which is at the national level. This allows us to have an inside track into what to look out for and what to network.

#### INSTRUCTIONAL UPDATE

Our high school students completed the NOCTI pre-test. They are currently setting goals with their instructors. We learned at the CTE conference that having completers reaching the workforce readiness score impacts some of our funding. Each program has its own workforce readiness score.

Simulated workplace is now school wide with both our high school programs and our ACE programs. Donna noted that she meets with the student supervisors once a month to discuss leadership, goal setting, and also talk about the simulated workplace benchmark.

Donna mentioned that we will have our first round of drug testing in the next few weeks. This is part of SWP policy.

ACE student instructional update—we have completed the NOCTI testing with our adult electrical students. They are the only ACE class required to take the test. ABE serves Rumsey students as well as the community for things like high school equivalency and life and study skills.

Adult Education will no longer be using the HiSet test for high school equivalency. They are going back to the GED which will go into effect January 1, 2024. This means all of the sites need to be compliant with Pearson Vue.

# **2023-2024 ENROLLMENT**

Donna updated enrollment for 2023-2024 (information enclosed in packet). She believes we are making a comeback from COVID. Last year our enrollment was about 350 high school students and this year we have 444. Donna explained that year 14 is when a high school student starts their program as a senior in high school. They come back after graduation to complete their program.

#### **BUSINESS AND INDUSTRY UPDATE**

Donna provided a Business and Industry update. She mentioned the uptick in our request for CDL training in response to national and federal regulations. Russell is actively developing partnerships with various businesses. Currently we have partnerships with Twisted Trunk, Volvo, Orgill, and First Energy. We are also working on Border Patrol. We are also developing a partnership with our Phlebotomy Program and WVU East.

## JRTI COMPANY LAB ENTREPRENEURSHIP SITE UPDATE

The Entrepreneurship site is very busy. Betsy has over 50 clients that are in different stages of their business plan. We looked into hiring a part-time employee but because of the growth, we will be using the remainder of the funds to hire a full-time instructor. We are also working with a company called Co.Starters that actually does cohorts for people who are entrepreneurs. Donna mentioned that some of her clients are our students but many of them are from the community.

#### COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT UPDATE

Donna reported on the following community engagements:

- Working with the Rotary Club to do displays for their Hope Gala
- Fall yard sale is October 14, 2023 (rain or shine)
- Other schools in different counties and states visiting to observe SWP

#### CAREER TECHNICAL STUDENT YOUTH ORGANIZATION UPDATE

JRTI is doing school-wide participation in SKILLS USA. Our Applied Engineering teacher has been able to get us approved as a charter member of the Robotics National Honor Society.

#### **FACILITIES UPDATE**

The Early Childcare building SBA project is now wrapping up. We are still waiting on one item to complete the project. Our HVAC upgrade is still not going well. We are still having issues with brand new units that have sensors dying. Donna mentioned that she will not pay the last payment until everything is fixed. With the ventilation grant, we are finishing up designs to add ventilation to the following programs:

- High School Automotive
- Postsecondary Automotive
- Diesel/CDL
- Masonry

Donna mentioned that she needs to do the RFP for the Commercial Driving/Diesel upgrades.

#### **COUNSELING FOR CAREERS**

Currently we are doing our 10<sup>th</sup> grade tours which will be complete at the end of the month. In November, interested students will come back and interview for the various programs. We are also starting our Mobile Career Center's visits to the middle schools. Our middle school tours will begin in November. Our fall open house is on November 7, from 5:30-7:30. Our ACE staff is starting to participate in the various career fairs.

# SCHOOL CULTURE UPDATE

On October 30, 2024 we will host a community-wide Trick or Treat from 6:00-7:00p.m. On Thanksgiving Day we are hosting the Turkey Trot 5K/run. We are partnering with Healthy Berkeley as well as the United Way. Our leadership team will be doing something with the Bethany House in December.

One of the bigger changes we made in school culture is we added the "Employee of the Month," for each program. Each program has a sign by their door with a photo of their employee of the month.

- A. November 3 Aviation Expo at Leesburg Airport. 13 students and 2 instructors
- B. November 13-15 Culineering Challenge Competition, Huntington, WV. 5 students and 2 instructors.
- C. November 14 HS Automotive and Diesel students to Penske, Hagerstown, MD. 30 students and 2 instructors.

Kristen Tuttle moved, seconded by Pete Gordon, to approve the trips as presented; carried.

## **DIRECTOR'S GOALS**

Donna went over her instructional goals.

High School—Donna would like our high school completers to be SOLID completers. She would like to see 90% of the completers receive the James Rumsey Certificate. This means the students will need a "C" or higher over the four core courses, they will need a "C" or higher on their portfolio, and they can't have more than 20 absences regardless of the reason over the two-year period.

ACE—Donna's goal for ACE is to have an 85% completion rate. She mentioned that COE only requires 70% but she would like 85%.
